A geophysical survey was made of these claims starting about the 15th. of May, 1956 and was completed on the 15th. of August, 1956.

A base line 10,200 ft. long was cleared down the center of the property and chainage stakes placed at every 100 ft. station. At every 200 ft. station, lines were run to the right and left of the base line for a distance of 1500 ft. with chainage stakes placed at every 100 ft. station. In this way, the property was marked off in 100 ft. X 200 ft. rectangles. Magnetometer readings were then taken at each of these points.

Details of the magnetometer readings are shown on map enclosed herewith.

The general background count appears to be 1000 to 1700. Readings higher than this indicate the presence of some magnetic material, and as magnetite is very common in this area, the readings of over 2000 probably indicate the presence of magnetite.

The location of the magnetic anomalies in relation to the claim boundaries and the limits of the magnetometer survey are shown on the accompanying map.




