REPORT ON GEOPHYSICAL SURVEY OF LUCKY JIM NOS. 1, 2, 3 & 4 MINERAL CLAIMS KAMLOOPS MINING DIVISION

Under our supervision a magnetometer survey was completed on the Lucky Jim Nos. 1, 2, 3 & 4 mineral claims which are a portion of the Vanex Minerals Limited holdings in the Meadow Creek area, Highland Valley.

A sharp No. 3 magnetometer was used in the survey. The readings were taken at 300' intervals as shown on the accompanying map.

A background of 27400 was taken and the readings shown on the map are the difference between the actual readings on the instrument and the background count.
