

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ABSTRACT

Rayfield Mining Company Ltd. (NPL) holds 20 mineral claims in the Coquihalla area near Hope, B.C. Gellco Explorations Ltd performed a soil sample survey for copper over the property. Results of the survey show that a few anomalous analyses of soil samples were encountered near the east end. Recommendations for further work are made. Dear Sirs:

This report summarizes the copper soil sampling survey performed on the 20 CM mineral claims by Gellco Explorations in the Coquihalla area, Hope, B. C. The work was done during September and October of 1967. The author has not visited this property but is familiar with the area in general, having visited a nearby property.

SUMMARY:

<u>Results</u>: Some copper geochemical readings have been encountered at the east end of the claim group.

<u>Recommendations</u>: Mineral claims CM 1 - 4 Inclusive should be held in good standing. A program, costing about \$2,000.00 can be envisaged to adequately check out the anomalous readings on these claims. Work would consist of geological mapping where possible, further geochemical sampling, and a magnetometer survey.

LOCATION:

The claims lie on the north side of Peers Creek in the Coquihalla drainage east of Hope, B. C. The property is in the New Westminster Mining Division at about $49^{\circ}23^{\circ}$, $121^{\circ}17^{\circ}$, in the N.T.S. number 92 H 6.

TOPOGRAPHY AND ACCESS:

Access is by four wheel drive from the Coquihalla Road. A logging road passes through the claims. The terrain is difficult to traverse because of dense underbrush, heavy tree growth and steep mountain sides. The westernmost claims are in the valley near the mouth of Peers Creek at an altitude of 1,000 feet, whereas the easternmost claims lie near 3,500 feet.

CLIMATE, WATER SUPPLY, ETC.

Plentiful but erratic precipitation both summer and winter, support numerous streams; July and August being the driest months. Field season in this region lasts from about June to October. Good stands of timber occur in most of the region.

CLAIMS:

Nineral claims CM 1 - 20 inclusive, owned by Rayfield Mining Company Ltd. (N.P.L.) by right of purchase, expire on December 14, 1967. Their record numbers are 18392 - 18411 Inclusive.

GEOLOGY:

Geological mapping as shown on Map 737A indicates that the property is underlain by rocks of the Hozameen series. Mr. E. North of Gellco Explorations observes that on the property, vegetation and shallow overburden obscure most of the bedrock except in the lower part of Peers Creek where folded argillites with minor limestone and some dioritic rock are exposed along the logging road.

Little information is available regarding the claims on the east higher up the mountain. The map in Cairnes' Memoir 139 suggests the presence of greenstones approximately where the easternmost claims would lie. Greenstones have been known to host mineralization in the area.

SOIL SAMPLING PROGRAM:

<u>Crew</u>: Gelleo Explorations performed the survey and supplied the crew consisting of E. North and D. McLean.

<u>Procedure:</u> A grid was cut with baselines at 090° and 077°. The lines at 500 feet had sampling stations every 500 feet up to a total width of 3,000 feet centred by the baseline.

Samples wore taken near bedrock and in most cases the profile consisted of about 6 inches of humus overlying 12 inches of soil. In a few samples vegetal matter was included in the soil sample indicating paucity of a soil cover on bedrock.

Analysic: Copper was extracted using hot nitric acid and analyzed by atomic absorbtion.

RESULTS:

Results are plotted on the accompanying plan. Some minor anomalies have been outlined. An overall background value of around 30 p.p.m. copper could be used on this survey. Higher values occur at the east end.

CONCLUSIONS:

The soil sampling survey performed at reasonable cost, did cover the 20 CM mineral claims. Results indicate anomalous values near the east end of the claim area approximately covered by CM 1 - 4inclusive. Further ground work in this restricted area is necessary to check out the anomalous samples.

FURTHER WORK:

The following costs can be allocated towards a more detailed survey, (geophysical, geochemical and geologic) of the four claims:

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1. Let mineral claims CM 5 20 inclusive expire.
- 2. Apply assessment to CM 1 4 inclusive to hold until December 1972.
- 3. Follow-up anomalous copper soil readings by more detailed ground work mentioned above at a cost of \$2,000.00.
- 4. Base further work on results of this program.


Field Report Of Soil Sample Survey for Rayfield River Mining CO.

In reply to the letter of the 23rd January, 1968 from Mr. J. F. McDonald, Gold Commissioner, 1 offer the following:


- 1. All samples were bared by a mattock and scooped up with the mouth of the paper envelopes provided by T. S. L. Laboratories Ltd.
