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INTRODUCTION

Giant Explorations Limited (N.P.L.) is carrying out a comprehensive exploration program in an area lying between Harrison Lake and the Giant Mascot nickel mine on Stulkawhits Creek. In the summer of 1969, 242 mineral claims were staked for the Company to cover this area.

The exploration program is being carried out in two stages as follows:

<u>Stage I</u> - preliminary stream sediment sampling; contour soil sampling; airborne magnetometer surveys; and geological reconnaissance, for the purpose of defining areas of basic and ultrabasic rocks which may be of interest.

<u>Stage II</u> - close prospecting, together with detailed geochemical-geophysical surveys to cover those areas of interest located during Stage I.

This report, which is the second report on the area within the past month or so, describes a portion of the Stage I work which relates to 114 claims centered on Talc Creek and the report has been written for assessment work purposes. When the Giant Mascot mine plant was destroyed by fire on August 2, 1970, some 215 geochemical samples which were applicable to the claims and which were awaiting assay, were also destroyed. Assay values are therefore missing for these samples.

PROPERTY - continued

They are located in an area of rugged topography with fairly dense forest growth. Elevations range from 100 feet to 5,500 feet above sea level, with one mountain peak rising to nearly 7,000 feet. Some logging operations have been carried out in the lower areas. Heavy snow pack imposes a very short exploration season at the higher elevations.

GEOLOGY

The area is underlain by Chilliwack group sediments and intercalated volcanics of carboniferous and later age, which have been intruded by magmas of dioritic, basic, and ultrabasic composition. Soil cover is extensive in the valleys but there is a good percentage of rock outcrop at higher elevations.

GEOCHEMICAL SURVEYS

Contour soil sampling was carried out on, and adjoining, the claim groupings. Samples were taken at sufficient depth to be reasonably free from organic matter. Sample contours were spaced at \$\frac{+}{2}\$ 400 foot vertical intervals, with individual samples being taken at 200 foot horizontal spacing. Positioning control was attained through use of Thommen altimeters, 1:50,000 scale contour maps, and aerial photographs. All sample locations were flagged and numbered.

Drying and screening of the soil samples was carried out at field headquarters after which the -80 mesh fraction was forwarded to the Giant Mascot Mine assay laboratory. Here a one gram portion of the sample was heated in a test tube over an open flame until the organic matter was burned off. It was then digested with nitric acid for one and a half hours in a hot water bath and followed by cooling, mixing and settling. Values in PPM for nickel, copper and lead were obtained with an atomic absorption machine.

Sample locations and numbering are shown on Maps No. 3 and 4, while metal values in PPM are shown on Map No.'s 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10.

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
