#### INTRODUCTION

A soil geochemical survey was carried out on the Ed mineral claims on Haylmore Creek, B.C. between June and August, 1970. All work was done under the guidance of the writer, with field supervision provided by Mr. J. P. Henry of MacDonald Consultants Ltd.

#### LOCATION AND ACCESS

The Ed claims are located along the valley of Haylmore Creek, which flows northwesterly into the southernmost end of Anderson Lake.

Access to the property area is via paved highway from Vancouver to Pemberton, and secondary road from Pemberton to Darcy at the southern end of Anderson Lake. Local access is provided via logging roads along the valley of Haylmore Creek.


#### TOPOGRAPHY, VEGETATION

Hillsides in the area are extremely steep on either side of Haylmore Creek, with local precipitous sections. Tributary creeks run in deep narrow canyons into Haylmore Creek.

The area is covered by a heavy forest of hemlock and spruce. Some logging in the area is apparent at lower elevations along the Haylmore Valley.

#### PROPERTY

The work described covers mineral claims recorded in the office of the mining recorder in the Lillooet Mining Division, B.C. as follows:

#### HISTORY

Copper mineralization was discovered in the vicinity of Steep Creek by the writer during the summer of 1969. Claims were subsequently staked to cover possible sources of the mineralization.

There is no indication of previous work on the claims.

#### GENERAL GEOLOGY

Regional government geological maps indicate the claim area to be underlain by a series of late Paleozoic and/or early Mesozoic sediments and volcanics which have been intruded by granitic rocks of chiefly Jurassic age. Early Tertiary intrusives are described as occurring in the immediate area.

#### GEOCHEMICAL SURVEY

Stream sediment sampling together with reconnaissance soil sampling, was conducted over the entire claim area. Detailed sampling was completed

on a line grid established between Limey and Henry Creeks.

Soil samples were gathered each 200 feet along contours from 500 to 1,000 feet apart over most of the claim area. On the line grid, established using chain and compass with stations flagged and numbered every 200 feet, samples were taken at each 200 feet station, along lines spaced 400 feet apart. A total of 995 soil and silt samples were collected. Soil samples were taken with mattocks from the "B" horizon wherever possible. All samples were packed in prenumbered, high wet strength paper bags supplied by the assay office.

All samples were analysed for copper and molybdenum by Bondar-Clegg and Co. Ltd., 1500 Pemberton Avenue, North Vancouver, B.C. The -80 mesh fraction was digested in hot aqua regia and assayed by atomic absorption.

Assay results are shown on the geochemical maps included in the pocket at the back of this report.

Background value for copper on the Ed claims was estimated to lie between 40 and 60 ppm. Values in excess of 80 ppm. might therefore be considered to be significantly anomalous.

Contour soil sampling indicated two areas of anomalous copper content.

These are located immediately west of the mouth of Limey Creek on the

Ed 2 claim, and a smaller anomaly on the south bank of Haylmore Creek

on the Ed 41 and 43 claim.

Grid soil sampling in the vicinity of Steep and Henry Creeks indicated a prominent anomalous area approximately 1,400 feet in width and over 4,000 feet in length which strikes in a northwest direction. This anomaly

is outlined on the Ed 3, 5, 23-26, 50 mineral claims.

On the Ed 49, 53 claim a smaller anomaly is apparent at a point approximately half-way between Henry and Steep Creeks. Another anomalous area was outlined on Henry Creek on the Ed 33 claim approximately 1000 feet by 500 feet in dimension (planar).

Another anomaly occurs on the Ed 38 and 36 claims and on the Ed 25-26 claims.

Background values for molybdenum were in the O-2 ppm. range. Values in excess of 4 ppm. might therefore be considered to be significantly anomalous.

Contour sampling outlined a small anomaly on the Ed 33 claim on Henry Creek, probably related to seepage in the area and thus considered to be non-significant. Grid sampling showed a small anomaly on the Ed 24 claim, coincident with a copper anomaly outlined in the area.

Several spot high anomalous values are present on the claim which are considered to be non-significant.

Detailed geology and possible suitable geophysical methods are necessary to evaluate the anomalies outlined above.

#### SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS

- Between June and August 1970 a total of 995 soil and silt samples were collected on contour traverses and a line grid of approximately 40.0 miles extent.
- 2. Two copper anomalous areas were outlined by the contour sampling.

- 3. Soil sampling on the line grid outlined five copper anomalous areas of varying extent. The main anomaly is located on the Ed 3, 5, 23-24, 50 mineral claims, where a small coincident molybdenum anomaly occurs.
- 4. Detailed geological mapping and suitable geophysical techniques
  may be necessary to further determine the nature of the above
  described geochemical anomalies and their possible significance.
