#### INTRODUCTION:

The following report is on a ground magnetic survey over the CU-RL claims, Allison Creek, Princeton, B.C.

#### GENERAL GEOLOGY AND TOPOGRAPHY:

The east half of the property is underlain by Upper Triassic Nicola volcanics and sediments. The west half of the property is mainly underlain by quartz diorite.

Relief is moderate.

#### MAGNETOMETER SURVEY TECHNIQUE:

A McPhar model M 700 vertical force fluxgate magnetometer was used for the ground survey. This instrument has a readability of 10 gammas.

Stations were read at 100' intervals on a 400' line spacing. Established base stations were regularly read for diurnal variations.

#### COMPILATION OF SURVEY DATA:

The survey readings were corrected for diurnal changes as determined by baseline checks. Data were contoured on a 500 gamma interval. This was determined to be the most useful interval to show up gross magnetic features.

#### SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS:

The west part of the property of more regular magnetics is coincident with areas partly mapped as quartz diorite. The east part of the property with more irregular high and low magnetics is coincident with areas partly mapped as Nicola volcanics, while the general north-westerly trend corresponds with the regional attitude. The intrusive-volcanic contact can be postulated as trending north-south through the centre of the claim group and swinging south-westerly through the south-west part of the property.

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Line cutting costs - Allison Creek area, Princeton. CU & RL Claims

The costs incurred for line cutting in 1972 were required for touching up the base-line, re-blazing lines and re-chaining for 100' intervals for a magnetic survey. A road washout necessitated a daily walk to the grid of at least three miles.

I respectfully submit that these costs were necessary for the magnetic survey, since the line costs submitted in 1971 were only for a flagged grid suitable for reconnaissance geochemistry.

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
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
