Dear Sirs:

On April 21st 1973, in company with Mr. W. McLelland, I inspected the line cutting which had recently been completed on the BAR claim group in the Barriere area of the Kamloops Mining Division of B.C.

The base line has been run from the Initial Post of the BAR #35 and #36 south down the location line for a total distance of 9,600 feet. In the section of line inspected, it was found to run on a bearing of 180° (true). The line is well blazed and flagged with stations at 300 foot intervals. In order not to contravene Forestry Dept. regulations, the cutting of trees has been held to the bare minimum, also, as there was four to five feet of snow on the property at the time of the line cutting, there has been little slashing of underbrush to clear the line of sight. Once the snow has gone from the property, it may be necessary to slash the brush and lower tree limbs in order to provide a clear line of sight between stations.

The cross lines are cut at the 300 foot station intervals on the base line and are reported to run the width of the claim group, that is, 1,500 feet to the east and 4,500 feet to the west. Sections of eight different lines were checked. All were found to be run on a magnetic east-west bearing with stations marked at 100 foot intervals with flagging, and the station number inscribed on a picket or blaze. As with the base line, line cutting has been held to the minimum, but there should be no trouble following the blazes and flagging from station to station while carrying out the magnetometer and geochemical survey.

In general, I consider the lines inspected to be competently done considering the ground conditions at the time, and will be quite adequate for the purpose for which they are intended.



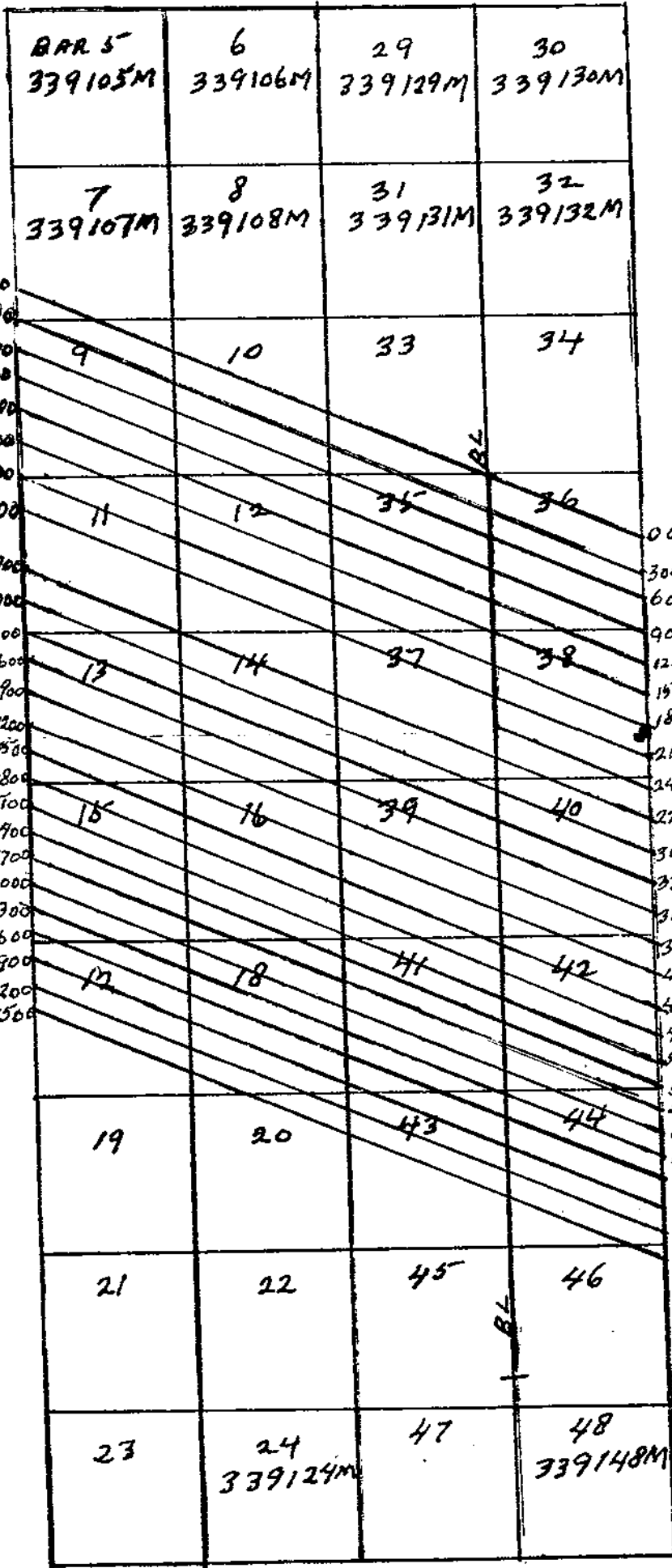
