I must apologize for the delay in getting a letter to you people. Since passing through Quesnel I have been out looking after another drill job and examining properties, and I was unable to chase down your assay certificate which was sent to an associated company.

The three assays averaged just better than 99% Si 2 with contaminates within acceptable limits. We are interested in your property as an alternate silica supply bearing in mind tonnage requirements needed as a captive source of ore for smelter feed. Unfortunately, I must again leave town to look after another drill job, but would appreciate your patience if you would await more follow-up by myself about the last week of August.
