Dear George and Thomas:


I must apologize for the delay in getting a letter to you people. Since passing through Quesnel I have been out looking after another drill job and examining properties, and I was unable to chase down your assay certificate which was sent to an associated company.

The three assays averaged just better than 99% SiO₂ with contaminants within acceptable limits. We are interested in your property as an alternate silica supply bearing in mind tonnage requirements needed as a captive source of ore for smelter feed. Thank you again for presenting your property to our company.

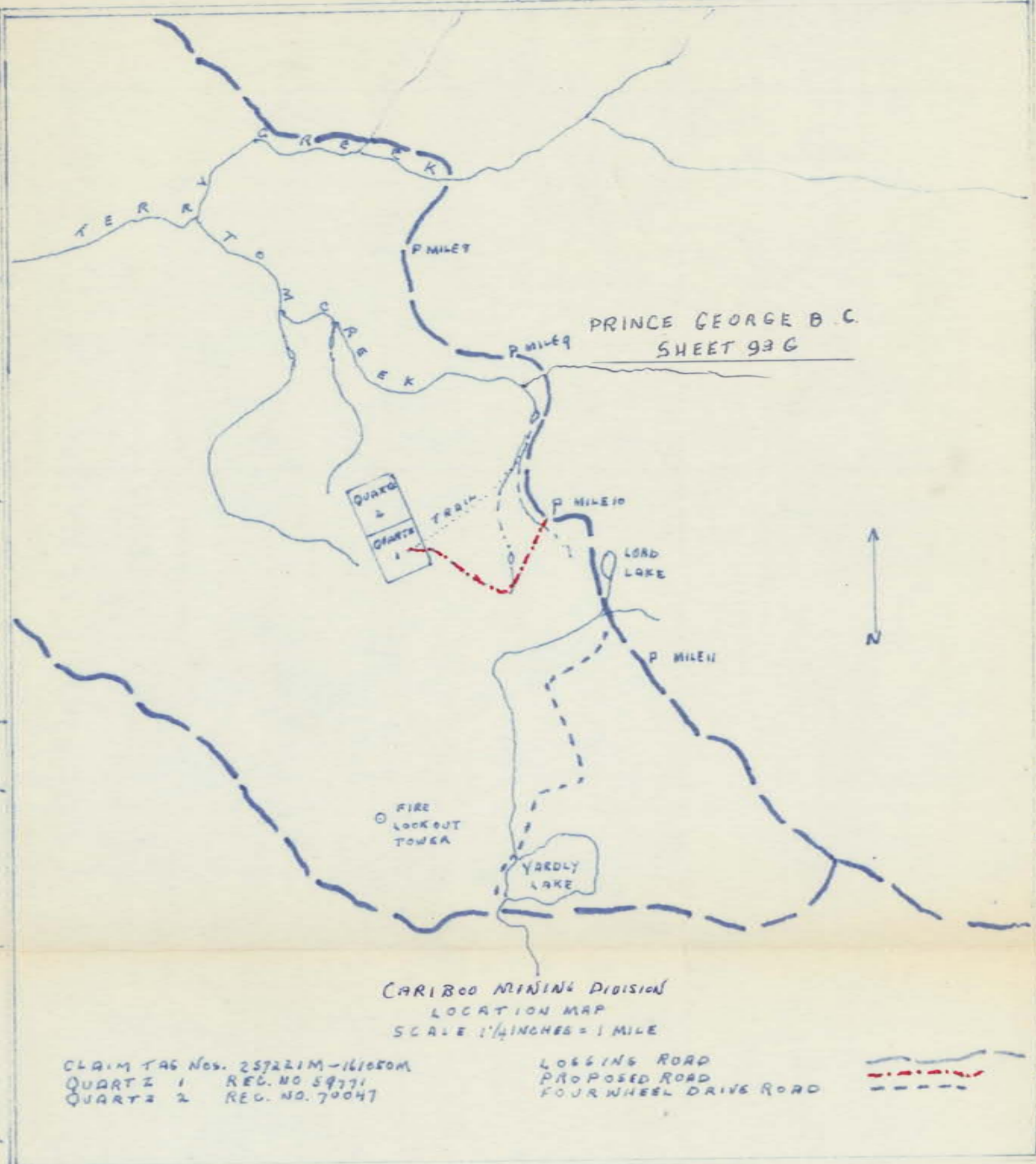
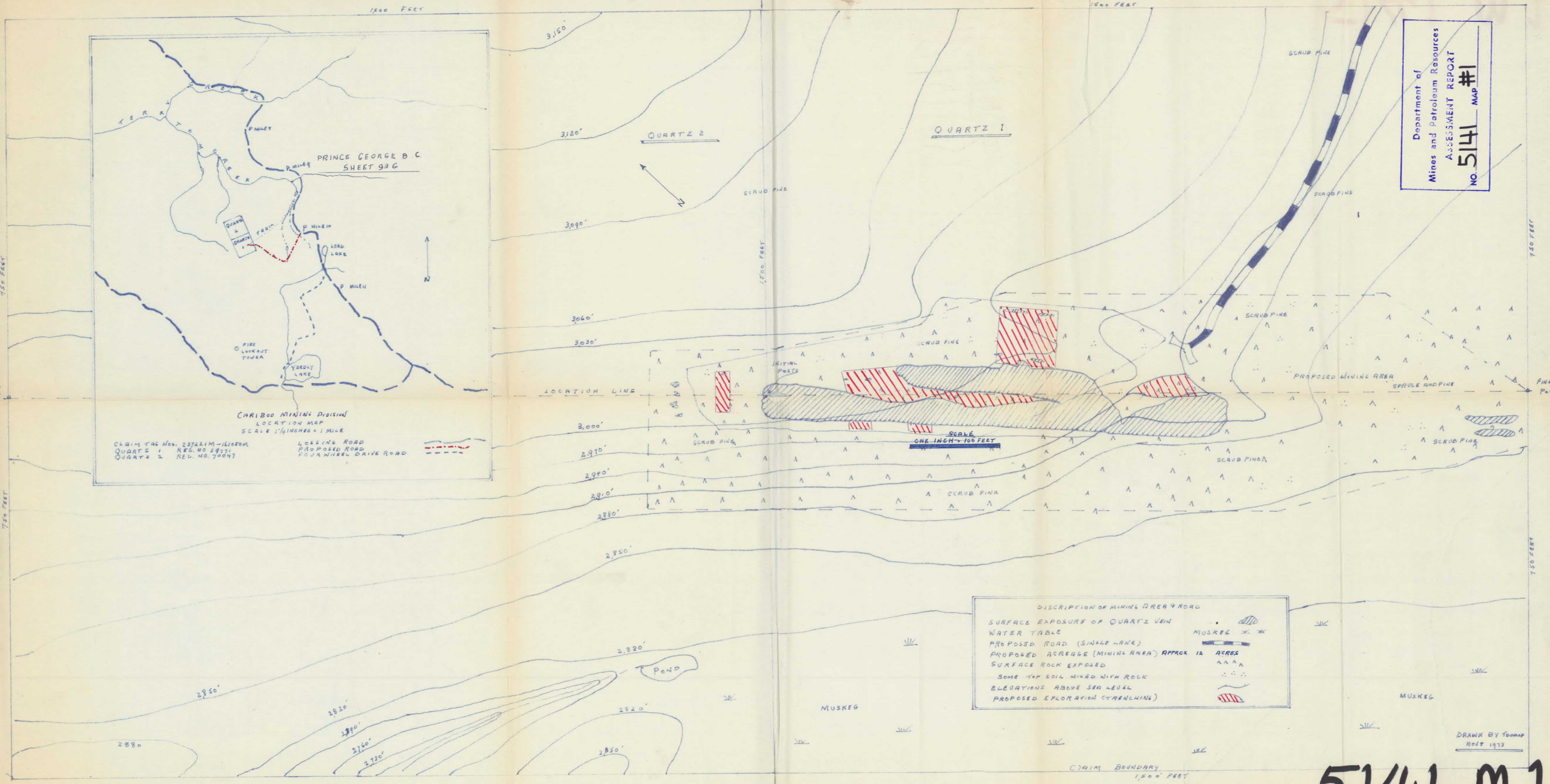
