

INTRODUCTION:

The OLD BALDY and JWG MINER mineral claims are located about 4 Km. northeast of Princeton, B.C. Work done in the past comprised of trenching and diamond and percussion drilling by many different operators. The area is an old, well-known copper prospect. The present work is based on a reinterpretation of existing data.

WORK DONE:

H. Horning was contracted to drill four percussion holes on the JWG Miner and the Old Baldy mineral claim near Princeton B.C. This job was completed in conjunction with another percussion drill job nearby in order to reduce mobilization and demobilization costs. All four holes were abandoned in overburden.

GEOLOGY:

The drill area is believed to be underlain by Nicola andesitic volcanics. The drilling was attempting to determine if a zone of known copper mineralization would extend towards the area of overburden. The holes did not penetrate to bedrock.

The overburden material in these holes was mainly sandy till. Many of the pulverized rock chips from boulders in the till were leucocratic granitic rocks and fresh andesite. Alternate methods will be required to evaluate this ground.
