Prospecting Report.

Introduction:

The areas prospected in this report are situated 24 miles approximately in a South-Easterly direction from the Town of Quesnel.

One follows the Barkerville road from Quesnel to Mile 24 which is where the bifurcation of the Swift River forestry road meets the main road; the forestry road is gravelled and in good condition. A multitude of logging roads in use or abandoned are branching everywhere on this logging main artery.

The regions prospected are situated from Mile 0 to Mile 16 on the North side of the road and from Mile 0 to Mile 11 on the South side.

The Isasa group of claims are on the right bank of the Sovereign Creek and also are the Wim-T.A. Claims. The Terry Group of claims is situated on the right bank of the Fontaine creek in an ultra-basic formation.

The reconnaissance prospecting done on the left bank of the Sovereign was mainly in the Chipp creek and the affluent east of it. A huge pyritic body was found on the left bank of the Chipp creek near the confluence with the Sovereign creek. From the road following the left bank of the Chipp creek I did a few reconnaissance in the creek, (every mile approximately) and analyzed any outcropping in view.

The creeks were panned for gold but the results were poor.

The ultrabasic formation was sampled for base metals and some indications are encouraging. The assay Office of the Department of Mines and Petroleum Resources did some assays of the samples and they were good indications of nickel. More work will be done on the claims.

I met several peoples prospecting for gold in the creeks, the price of the yellow metal is again attracting people in the Cariboo but I never saw them in such number.

At the end of the year I started prospecting in the Harrison Lake region on the west side of the Lake near Weaver Lake. I found some indications of zinc, copper (malachite), heavy pyritic formations.

Prospecting Report.

Areas prospected. Generally the North West corner of map 93A/13W(1).

The areas prospected are situated on the right and left banks of the Sovereign creek which is the main drainage basin of the region.

For several days I did the reconnaissance prospecting on the Chipp Creek and its valley and also on the creek directly to the east of the Chipp creek.

I worked quite extensively on the W.I.M. Cal and W.I.L. TA claims in what I described as a skarn formation in previous reports. The ground on those claims has been staked in 1977 and the claims are in good standing.

Chipp Creek: having received the prospector assistance grant for 1980, I already sent my prospector report on this area to the Ministry of Mines & Petroleum Resources where details have been submitted :

- 1-Area prospected per day.
- 2-Weather.
- 3-Itinerary followed each day, discoveries.
- 4-Geological formations when encountered.

For 25 days I started at 7.30 AM and terminated at 5PM. or later. After localizing the Chipp creek I started at the bridge near the confluence with the Sovereign creek. I followed the creek going upstream going from the left to right bank and investigating the rocks in the creek or on the banks. I found dark porphyritic rocks for 2 kms and then they disappeared and the thickness of the overburden increased.

The areas are heavily timbered and difficult to access. 50 metres from the bridge on the left bank I found a massive grey rock formation with 5% pyrites or sulfides in it. (See map attached to the report for localisation of the sulfides).

I went to see the chief geologist of Prince George, Mr. Klein, who did a microscopic analysis of the rocks but found no mineral of importance. This pyritic body extends on a distance of approximately 75 metres south on the bank.

I took some pans of gravel on each side of the creek, looking for gold without success; some black sand was found. I followed the creek by the road and went in the basin every kilometre. I found pits dug a long time ago by prospectors, one of them contained rocks with sulfides. One sample taken in the pit was sent to Victoria (Assay Department).

The results except for one sample are not encouraging.

I also found some argillite outcrop without any sulfides on the left bank (km I6). The source of the creek which is in a huge swamp on the top of the mountain is covered with heavy timber and prospecting is forbidden. (no test pit can be dug).

In the Chipp creek no granitic rock have been seen by myself. In the parts of the creek prospected. I climbed the hills in the surrounding of Km I7 and I8 to find some outcrops and detected some schists 200 yards from the left bank of the Chipp. (no mineralization).

The creek directly east of the Chipp was prospected this year where I panned the gravels for gold too without success.

I found some black sands but the creek contains more granitic rocks than the Chipp. I broke several sample of the granitic rocks but sulfides were found. Country heavily timbered and glacial drifts. Rocks mixed with heavy clays and boulders.

MIN-Cal claims: I found a new gossan approximately 500 metres west of the first one discovered in 1975 which contained gold, copper, molybdenum. After several days of prospecting I found some malachite in the limestone north west of the first gossan and pyrites. This area will be further investigated. Some mineral light prospect was done but no fluorite was discovered. Some digging will be done on the new gossan.

M.I.N.TA claims: I prospected step by step in creek no 3 and creek no 4 of the claims for debris of quartz, monzonite, zinc minerals, granitic rocks. I took geochemical samples in what I call the dry-bone formation and some zinc was found (see assays results in assays done by Bonda-Clegg). I found some talcose in the creek no 2 with pyrites and I did some dymethylglyoxine tests which gave good results. I dug a trench and a pit in creek no4 to trace the dry-bone rocks.

I searched extensively with my mineral light for fluorite in the granitic and other formations without good results. I found a new vein containing graphite (white marble with graphite).

Prospecting Report-(Continued).

Terry Claims on the Fountaine creek. I went on the logging road which starts at Mile 16 going North East, for 1 mile approximately, where I discovered boulders of green stones from an ultra-basic formation. Some sulfides were in the rocks. I started a trail from the end of the road and took an easterly direction going to the Fountaine creek. I encountered a huge formation with sulfides and responding to the dymethylglyoxine test for nickel.

I blazed my centre line for staking my Terry claims. I took several samples and sent them to the assay office in Victoria and the results are encouraging. More work will be done in these claims. See assays results from the work done in Victoria enclosed in this report and see map for locations.

Here the country is arid and also heavily timbered. The sulfides in the rocks are small but numerous and the magnetite and chromite valuable with the lens. Ni, Cr, Co, Au, Ag, are detected in the assays.

I dug a pit on the right bank of the Do-Do creek (WIM claims) looking for gold without success. I dug 1 metre deep and the water came in the pit.

Near the pit, in the breccia which contain sulfides, I cleaned the rock and took one sample which I sent to Cominco for testing and the results were:

Analytical method: Aqua-regia-solvent extraction.

Some blasting to have fresh samples should be done in the centre of the body to have better results with the tests. The claims are situated 2150 metres approximately in a northerly direction for the initial post and at the confluence with the reddish and fountaine creek; the good access is by the logging road and the trail shown on the map.

I looked for asbestos fibres but none were detected; I did some mineral light prospecting on the east side of the ultra basic formation but no fluorite was detected.

The distance from Quesnel to the claim by car is 10 kms more than the previous distance shown in my reports.

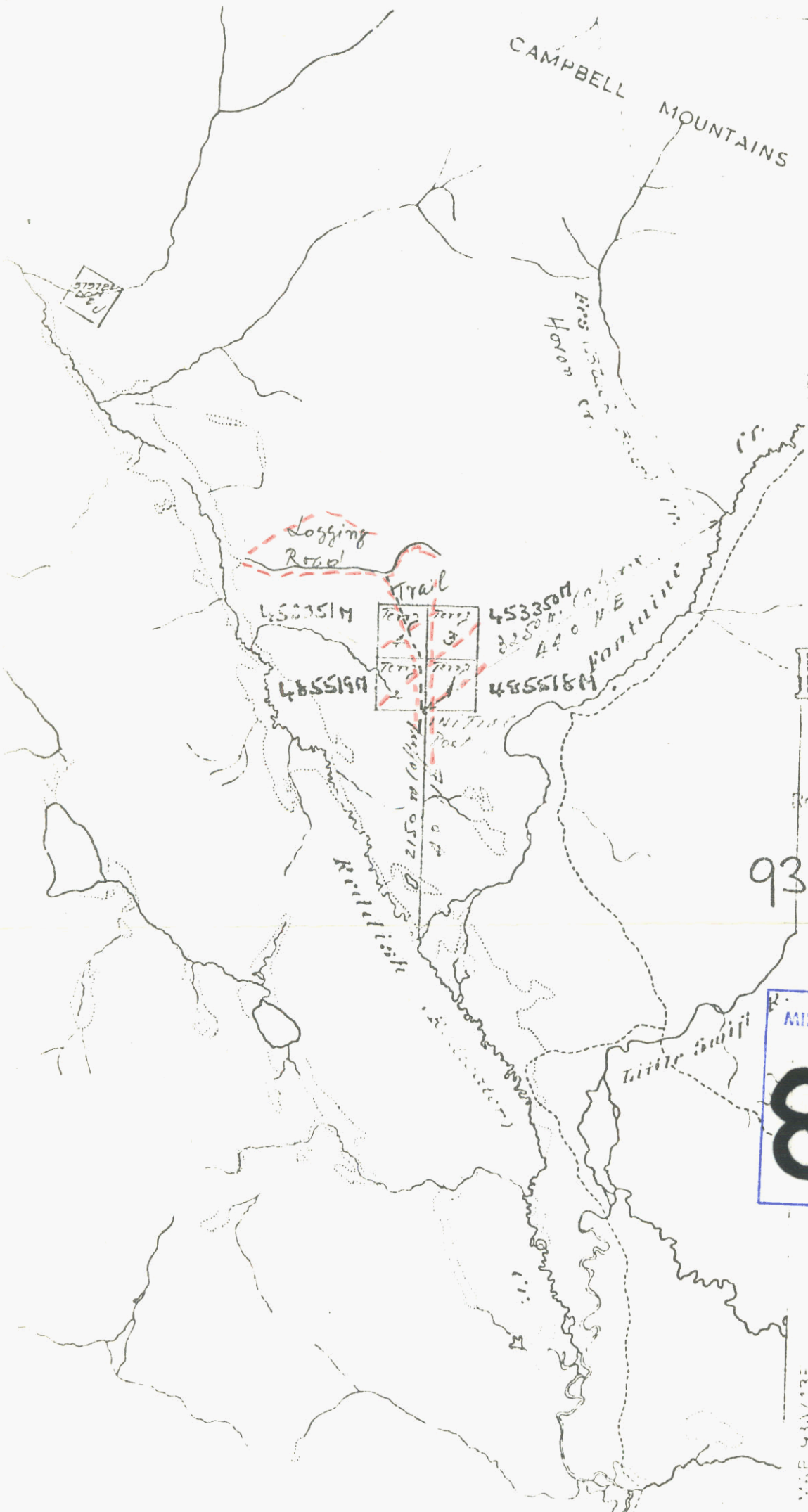
