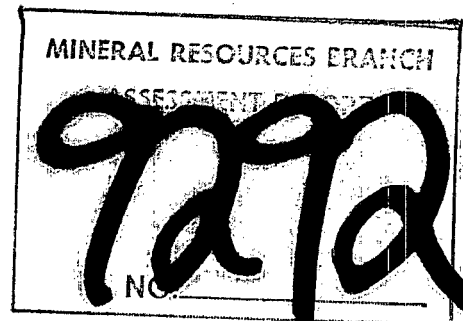

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Introduction and Report

A small prospecting program was begun on May 1, 1981 on the lower part (east) of the Cup 1-6 claims on Mt. Spencer. This first trip was made by the author alone as snow elevations were uncertain. The purpose of the prospecting was to establish (A) mineralization, if any, along the limestone-volcanic contact and (B) to establish the lower limits of the mineralized zones drilled previously by Gunnex and Cominco at the 3000' elevation approximately.

On my trip on May 1st I was not able to get much above the 2000' elevation level from the end of branch M3 McMillan-Bloedel's logging road, owing to patches of heavy wet snow. I was able to determine that the intrusive float in the 1st 2 Creek south from the end of the road were "dry" showing no mineralization. Also no mineralization was seen on the limestone-volcanic contact which is approximately on the 2000' elevation along this hill.

On May 9th the author, accompanied by my son Philip, made a traverse south from the end of branch M3. The object was to complete the prospecting of the contact zone and to pick up the lower (easterly) limits of the mineralized zone. This trip satisfied me that there is no mineral of any consequence along the contact zone where observed. Though some veining does occur near the S.E. corner of the claims. Also much float in the gravel banks along the creek.

This traverse thus eliminates the contact zone, but showed good float at the 3rd creek south from this road end, which apparently is coming from a zone below zone A3 drilled by Cominco.

My son had to leave so I was without a helper on May 10th. I prospected directly up the main creek from Museum Main to try and reach the zone of mineralization from where I left off yesterday. Found some impressive float at 2.700 elevation, some of this material looked as though from very local source. Flagged large piece laying on hillside at 2900' elevation.

On May 11th hired M. McCarthy of Port Alberni as helper. Went in from end of branch M3. Proceeded to 3rd creek south, followed float, Cu. Py, Pyer, Minor Mo, up to 3000' elevation. Some Cu. in place, also some intrusive Porphyry with Cu-Py and Minor Mo. This zone lays N.E. of and over a ridge from "Pats Vein" and is indicated as an unexplored zone. Snow prevented further exploration up-hill.

A helicopter camp will need to be set up to explore further as this distance in and out takes too much time.

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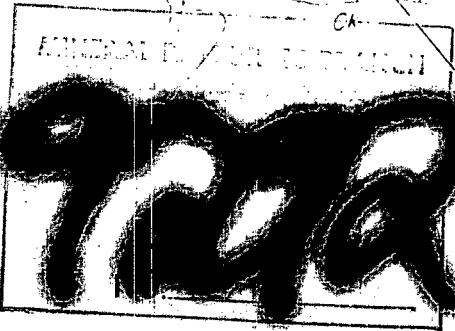
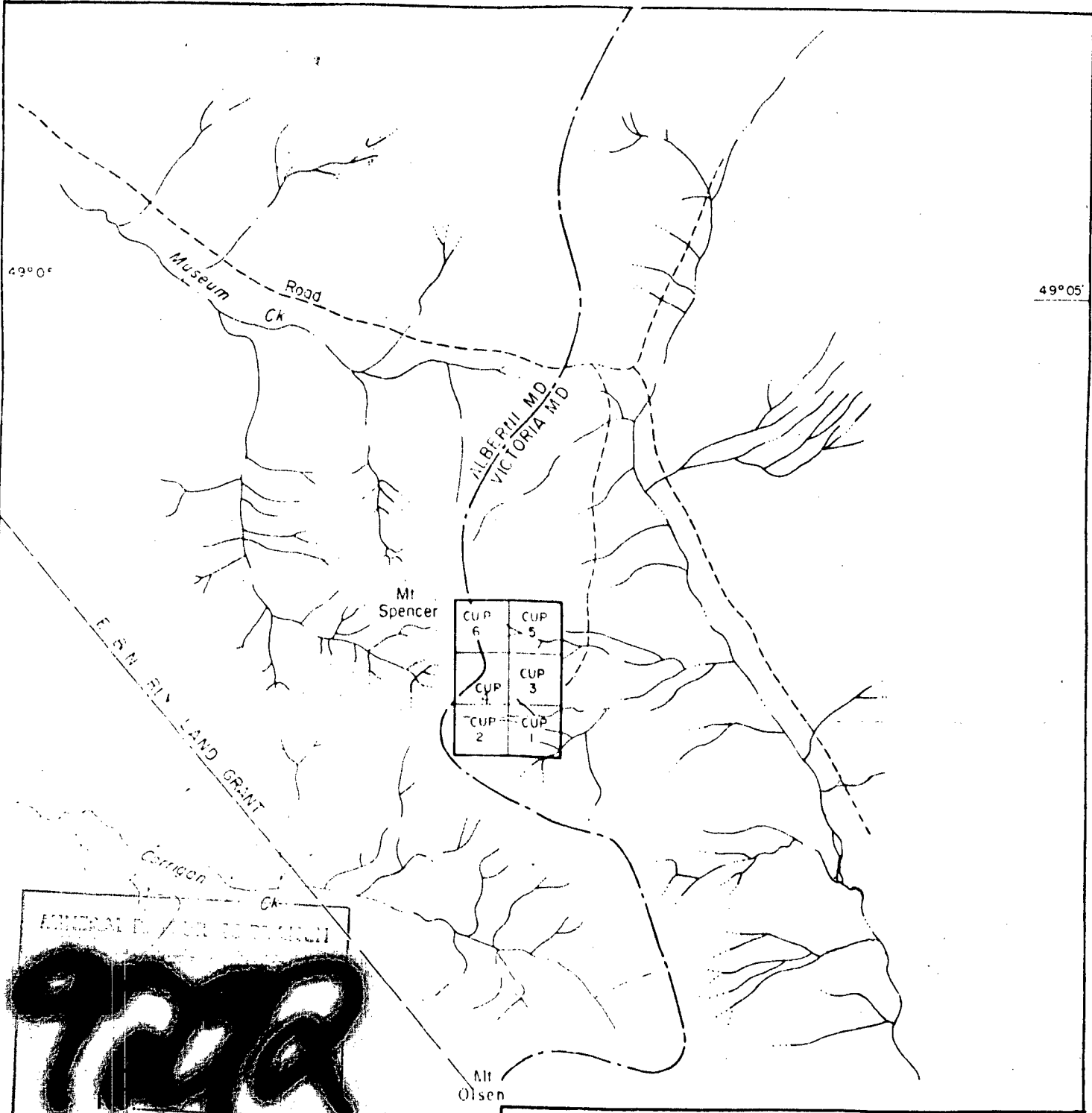

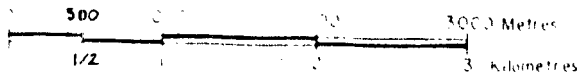

CLAIM MAP

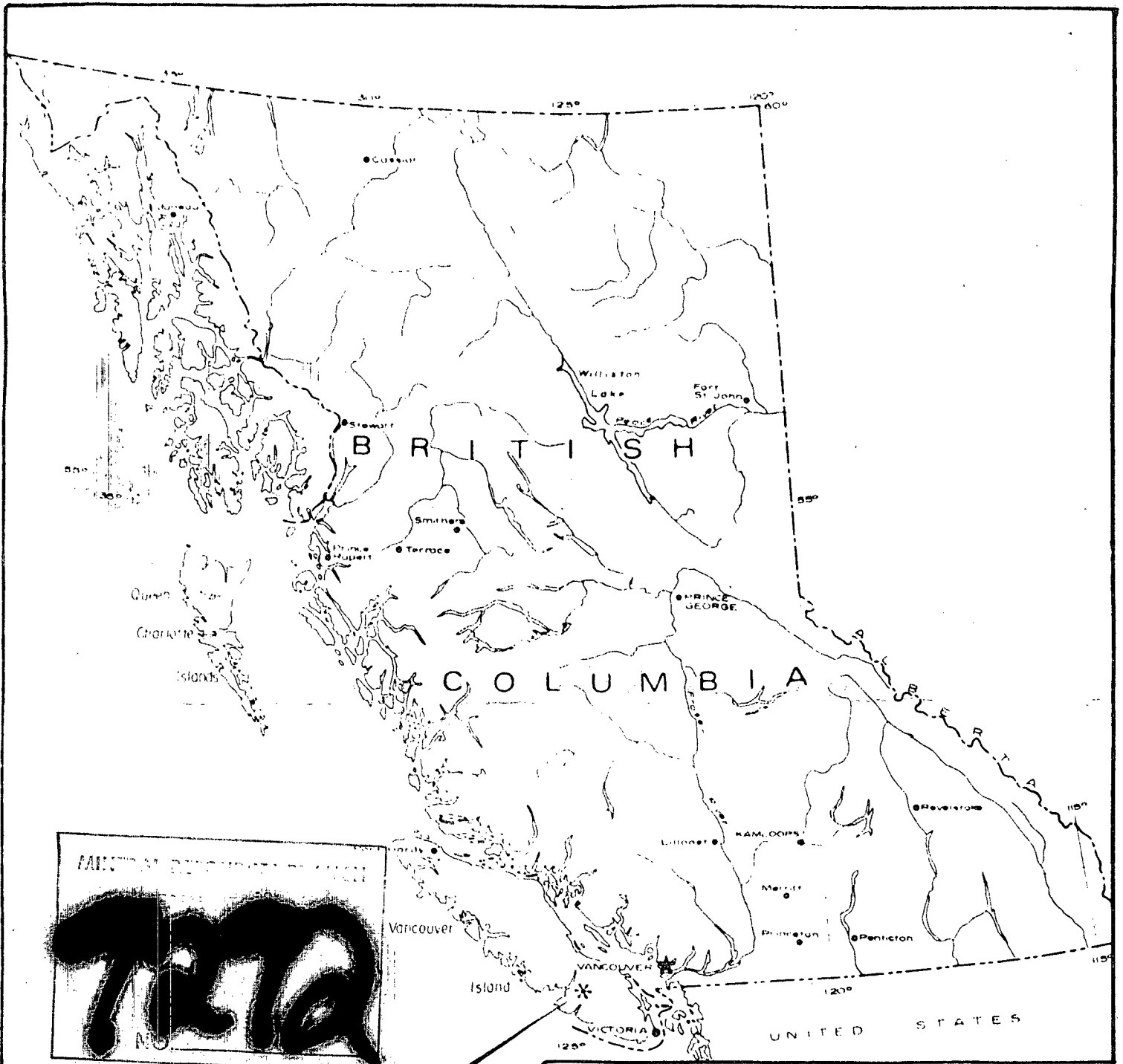

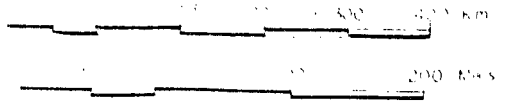

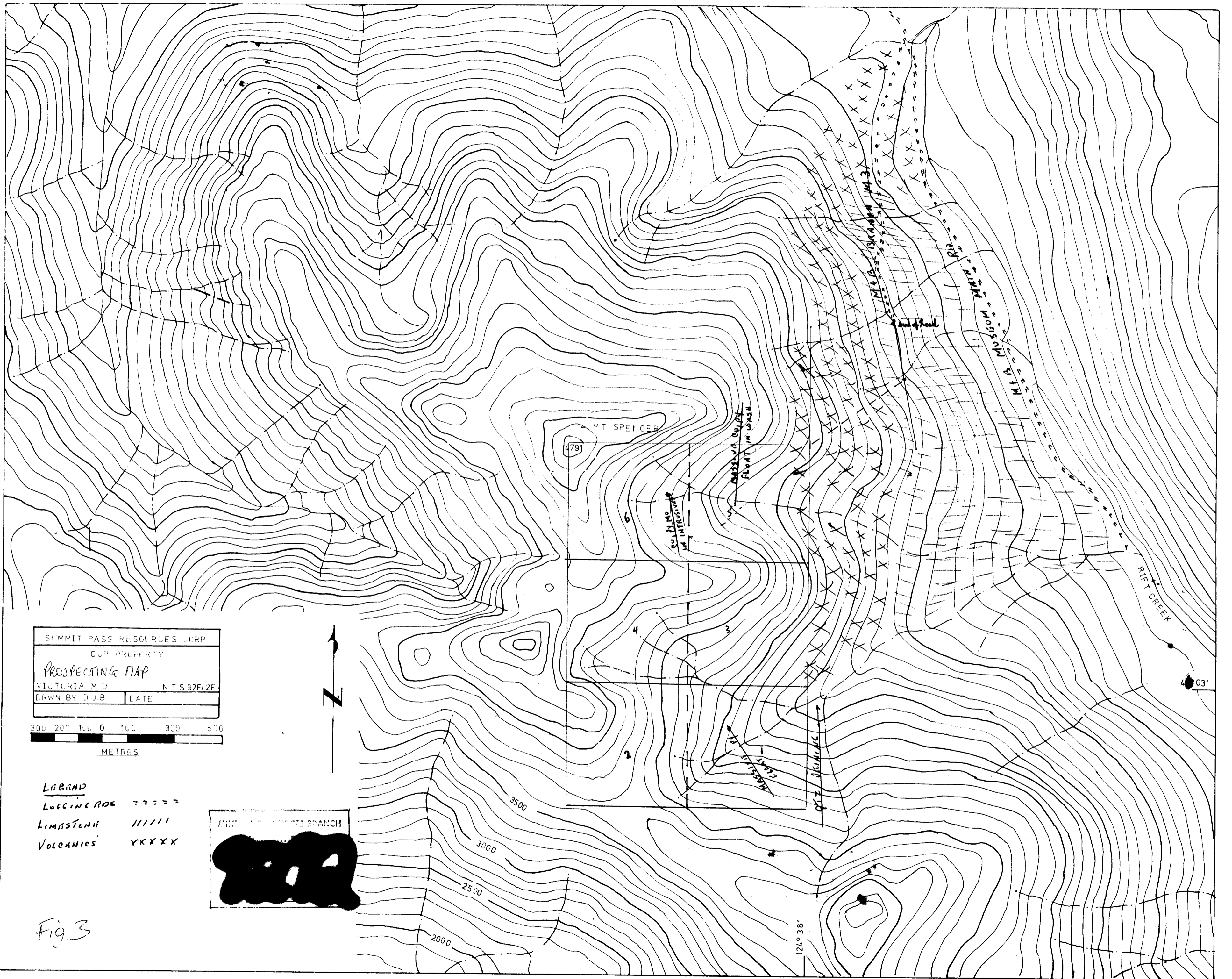

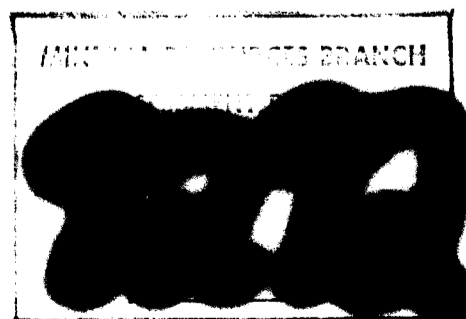
