

PROSPECTING REPORT ON THE RUDY AND WALTER CLAIMS N.T.S. 92 P 9 E

INTRODUCTION

The Rudy and Walter claims were staked by Rudy Bendixen and Walter Davidson June 8-11, 1981. The claims are located on Queen Bess Ridge near Black Pool station, north of Kamloops on the Canadian National Railway line.

Prospecting was conducted along the claim lines, trails and roads by Walter Davidson, in 1981.

Rock, mineral and soil specimens and samples were acquired and subsequently assayed by Chemex Laboratories of North Vancouver, B.C.


From May 3 to 7, and 17 to 21, 1982, additional prospecting was conducted over the claims area.

In addition, on the Rudy 16 unit, a 50 by 50 metre grid was established over a 4500 by 4500 metre area and soil samples were acquired from the "B" zone.

These samples were assayed by General Testing Laboratories of Vancouver, B.C.

Sketch Plan #4, included with this report, shows silver, lead and zinc content.

This report is based on field notes, sketch maps, photos and soil and mineral specimens supplied by Mr. Walter Davidson as well as British Columbia and Federal maps and reports.



LOCATION AND ACCESSIBILITY

The Rudy and Walter claims are located on the east side of the North Thompson River and Canadian National Railway line, 76 kilometres north of Kamloops, B.C., and 5 kilometres southwest of Blackpool station.

The property includes the northerly Queen Bess ridge at north latitude 51°-39' and west longitude 120°-08'.

Access is by secondary road 16 kilometres southerly from Clearwater.

PROPERTY

The Rudy and Walter claims were staked June 8-11, 1981 and recorded in Kamloops June 11, 1981.

Legal corner posts with tag numbers 68602 and 68603 are approximately 2.5 kilometres south 20 degrees west from the southwest corner of Lot 289, as shown on the accompanying claims map #2.

Each claim is 3 units east-west by 6 units north-south.

Record numbers are 3581 (6) and 3582 (6) for the Rudy and Walter claims.

HISTORY

The history of the area is available through references to the Queen Bess mine. The #1 adit tunnel and surface workings are located on the northwestern part of the Rudy claim as indicated on Sketch Plan #4 included with this report.

Prior to 1920, sufficient silver, lead, and zinc mineralization had been discovered with quartz in fissure veins to interest a financial group from Seattle to acquire an operating bond on the Queen Bess property.

A 50 ton-per-day concentrator was built, along with an office, superintendent's house, bunkhouse with kitchen and reading room and several cottages for married couples.

A tramline was constructed from the mine to the mill. The mine was operated for a short time in early 1919. The company had developed only a limited tonnage of available ore so underground work was only carried out for a short period. However, the operation was terminated in 1920 when only limited exploration and development work had been attempted.

The mine was reactivated in early 1927 by the Queen Bess Mining Company. Four levels were rehabilitated and some development work carried out, but the operation was again terminated in October of 1927.

Two 18-unit claims were located by Rudy Bendixen and Walter Davidson in June 1981. The property was thoroughly prospected, including soil sampling over a 4500 metre square area on a 50 metre grid.

TOPOGRAPHY

The dominant topographic features of the claims area are the steep bluffs which extend from the North Thompson River valley at 400 metres above sea level to the top of Queen Bess Ridge 770 metres above sea level.

Easterly, over the Walter claim, the topography levels off and is drained by Axel Creek which flows to the southwest.

McCarthy Lake is centrally located on the Walter claim and McCarthy Creek drains northerly into the North Thompson River.

GEOLOGY


The property is underlain by Mississippian and/or later pillow lava flows, greenstone, schist, argillite, andesite, chert, limestone, breccia, and minor amphibolite of the Fennel Formation.

A small exposure of Eocene and (?) or Oligocene Skull Hill volcanics include dacite, trachite, basalt, andesite and rhyolite of the Kamloops Group.

Faults trend north to northwest across the area.

The former Queen Bess mine workings are located on and near the north boundary of the Rudy and Walter claims.

Quartz veins up to 6 feet in width containing highgrade shoots of galena and sphalerite were mined and milled after World War One. These fissure veins were investigated to shallow depths. The work was concentrated on two of the veins and the property potential has not been delimited to depth or laterally.



PROSPECTING

Mr. Walter Davidson first prospected the area in 1969 when assisting with a Ronka 16 electromagnetic survey over selected areas of the Queen Bess holdings.

During May and June of 1981 Mr. Davidson again prospected the area while staking the Walter claim. Soil, rock and vein material was sampled.

In May of 1982, prospecting was continued on the claims and rock and vein samples and specimens were acquired.

In addition, a 50 by 50 metre grid was laid out over a 4,500 by 4,500 metre area west of Lots 288 and 289.

The grid covers parts of Units 15 and 16 of the Rudy claim.

One hundred and four samples were taken from B zone soil.

These were assayed by General Testing Laboratories of Vancouver.

The sample locations and assay results are included on Sketch Plan #4 of this report.

SAMPLES

In 1981, during the staking of the Rudy and Walter claims, random soil and vein samples were acquired. These were assayed by Chemex Labs Ltd. of North Vancouver,

INTERPRETATION

The Rudy and Walter mineral claims are located on and and adjoining the holdings and workings of the former Queen Bess mine.

Fissure veins containing quartz galena and sphalerite were mined up to 6 feet in width for short lengths and to shallow depths. Some veins were not investigated except by limited surface excavations and pits.

Prospecting of the Rudy and Walter claims has been thorough even to the extent of soil sampling a 4500 by 4500 metre area.

The following soil sample results are significant:

Silver: 13 samples assayed over 5ppm Ag, 6 over 8ppm

Lead: 31 samples assayed over 40 ppm Pb, 12 over 1000 ppm

Zinc: 34 samples assayed over 150 ppm Zn, 11 over 1000 ppm

The vein samples and specimens were selected to indicate the presence of excellent grade within the sulphide zones of the fissure veins.

The prospecting in 1981 and 1982 seasons demonstrates that the property is located in a geologically favourable area.

SUMMARY

The Rudy and Walter claims were staked June 8 to June 11, 1981 by Rudy Bendixen and Walter Davidson on the Queen Bess Ridge, Kamloops Mining Division.

Both claims were prospected by Walter Davidson in 1981 and again in 1982. Soil samples were acquired and assayed for silver, lead and zinc. Rock and vein samples and specimens were acquired. Some were assayed for silver and lead and zinc and duplicates were retained for megascopic examination.

All available data has been made available to the writer, which, along with government reports and maps provide the basis for this report.

It is herewith concluded that the Rudy and Walter claims areas have been thoroughly prospected by Mr. Davidson. The results of his field work indicate that this property is well located in an area known to be favourable for the occurrence of fissure veins containing highgrade silver, lead, zinc mineralization.
