


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

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SUMMARY-

Between October 15th, to October 19, 1982 a prospecting program was performed on the "Orb claims" Sunday creek group. This property is located approximately 20 kilometers S10⁰ of Princeton B.C.

The purpose of the program was to determan the the posibility of fresh gold being being deposited at the mouth of Sunday creek, through mechanical erosion of bedrock in the creek bed. Prospecting was conducted in the form of gravle panning.

Conclusions

Rather coarse fresh flower gold was found down streem from the mouth of Sunday creek. It is necessary to conclude the gold located at the base of Sunday creek originates from the imediate area due to its composition and shape. Friday, Saturday and Sunday creek all carry and produce fresh gold each year.

RECOMMENDATIONS

It is somewhat necessary to recommend a streem sediment survey be conducted under the direction of a professional geolagist. To attempt to locate the source of the fresh gold. The mineral claims are located some 25 km due south of Princeton B.C. covering Sunday creek between highway 3 and the Similkameen river. Lat. $49^{\circ}15$ 'N, Long.120° 33'W N.T.S. 92 H/7.

GENERAL GEOLOGY

The general geology of Sunday creek is shown on geology map 888A Princeton at a scale of 1"=4 miles. The property is shown to be underlain by rocks of the Princeton group. The survy appears to over lay varicolored lava; argilite, - tuff, limestone; chlorite and gneisse.

RESEARCH

In March the 1st 1982 Glen White geophysics conducted an air born electromagnetic survey. Glen White in his report"Airborn VLF-EM & Magnetometer survey" outlines a major magnetic anomaly on the Orb claims at the south side of Sunday creek. The gold in Sunday creek is found with massive ammounts of magnetite, it is my belief that the magnetic anomaly could be the source of the gold at the mouth of Sunday creek.

Dale Walster in his report"Geochemical studies of the Orb claims" states there are anomilous gold values found in two of the percussion drill holes, aproximatly two hundred meters east of Glen Whites airomagnetic anomaly. Geochemistry could be conducted to determin any posible corilation between the two anomilies.

RESREARCH cont.

The Sunday creek area is renound for producing gold, at least one hundred thousand dollars worth. This figure is probable low due to the fact that there were no records kept in the early days of production for nearly a quarter of a century. The Similkmeen river and the adjoining creeks were worked for years by the Chinese. Signs of their activities are still vidible on the banks of the river today.

PANNING SURVEY

Working on bedrock with a pan wisk and crowbar, produces gold on most of the creeks in the area. My survey began down streem from Sunday creek and I worked my way up the Similkameen river. There seems to be three distinct kinds of gold No.1 a lemmon yellow gold, nuggets usually one penny wieght in size or less. No.2 a copper coloured gold usually well rounded up to a half ounce in size, probably brought in by glaciation. No.3 a brown black spotted gold looks like Slough creek or Alaskan gold up to three penny weight.Flood gold usually the lemmon yellow variety is washedim to the Similkameen every spring by tributaries and smaller drainage creeks. Most of the gold I located was down streem from the mouth of Sunday creek this would indicate Sunday creek could be aposible producer of the fresh gold. REFERENCES
