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I. INTRODUCTION

A. Exploration Target

Taseko Project exploration target is bulk tonnage gold deposits.

B. Location, Access, Topography

Taseko Property is located in southwestern British Columbia, 200 km. due north of Vancouver. It occurs within the Clinton Mining Division and on the 92 0/3 map sheet at 51.11° latitude and 123.35° longitude.

Access is via road or plane from Williams Lake, 140 km to the northeast. Four wheel drive is required for a few sections of the road near the property.

Relief varies from gentle to steep, and the surrounding terrain is mountainous. Maximum elevation on Bluff 9 and 10 is 2316 m.

Vegetation is subalpine to alpine.

II. SOIL GEOCHEMISTRY

A. Sampling

Fifty-one ~~thirty-one~~ soil samples were collected from the B horizon at 50 m intervals along grid lines spaced 200m apart. Grid lines were established by chain and compass.

B. Analysis

Samples were analyzed by Chemex Labs Ltd., 212 Brooksbank Ave., North Vancouver. Copper, lead and silver analysis were by atomic absorption; gold analysis was by fire assay pre-concentration and atomic absorption finish.

C Results

Results are reported on figures 75, 76, 79 and 80. Anomalous thresholds were calculated statistically from an adjacent, much larger data set, and are as follows: Au - 40 ppb, Ag - 1.0 ppm, Cu - 100 ppm and Pb - 40 ppm. Anomalous areas are outlined on the figures by contouring.

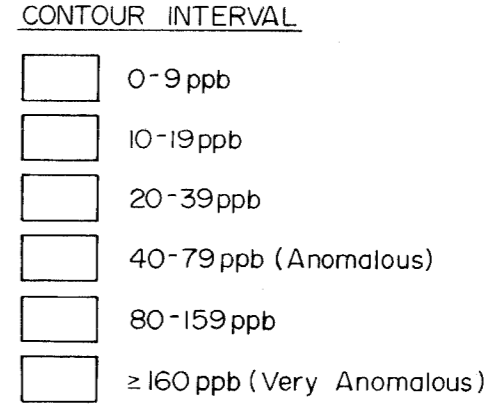
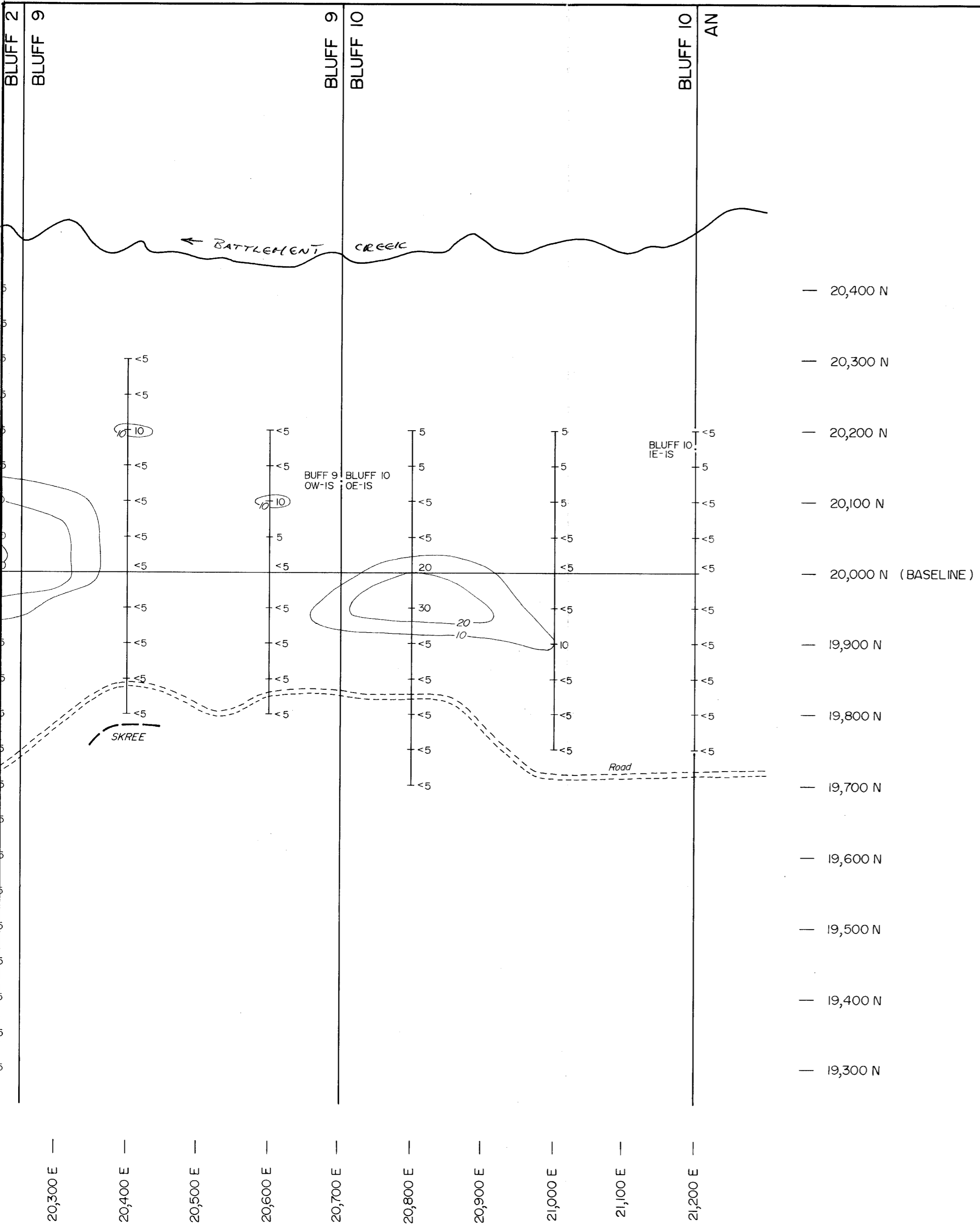
IV STATEMENT OF QUALIFICATIONS

I personally supervised the geochemical work described in this report.



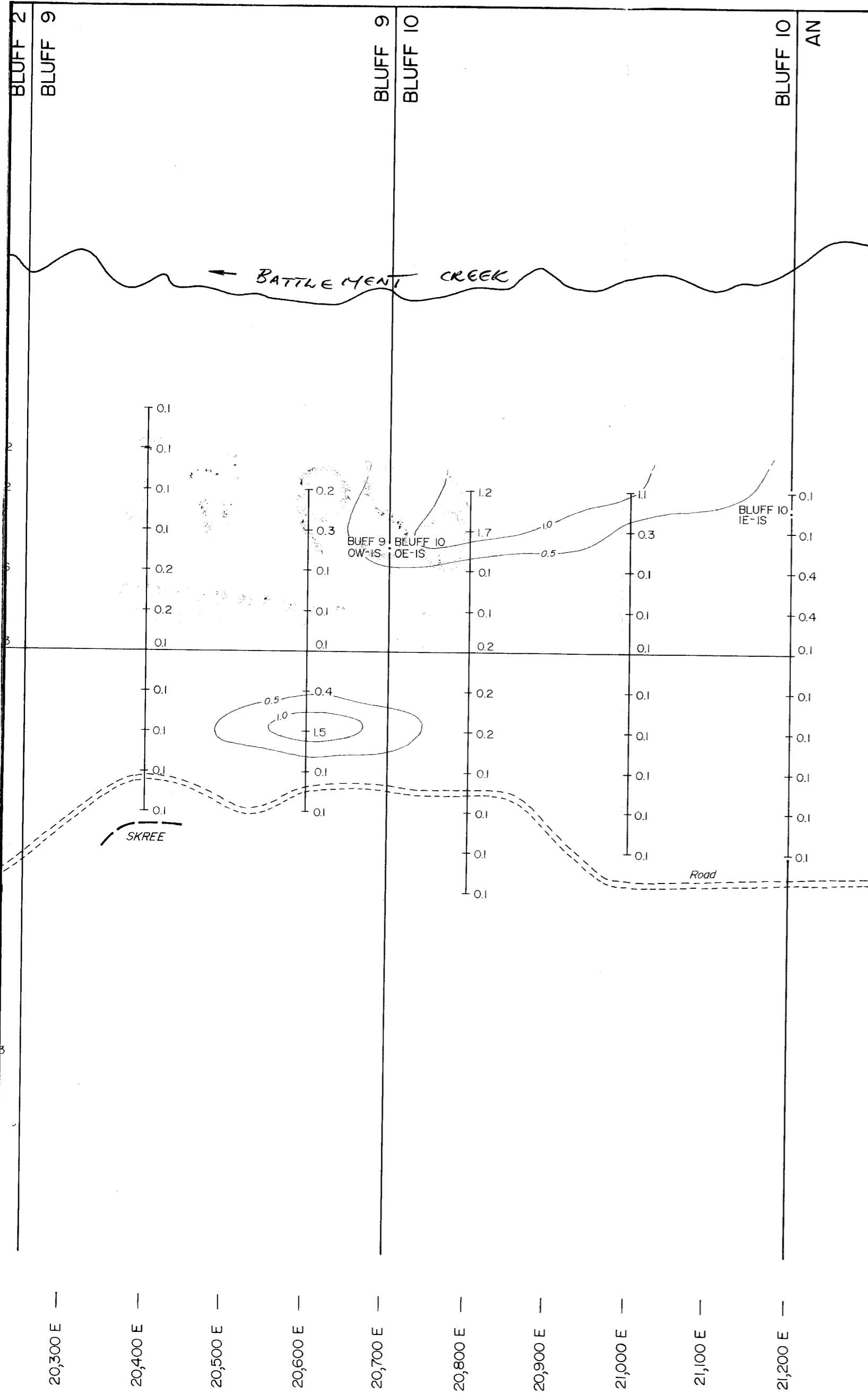
