Claims are approximately 20 miles west of Chemainus, B.C. just west of Copper Canyon and on north side of Chemainus River.

Claims are shown on B.C. Department of Mines mineral map number 92B/13W-M.

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Location:- Property shown on mineral map #91B/13W-M. Approximately 20 Km west of Chemainus, B.C. and on north side of same named river.

Access is easy with 4 wheel drive - follow main logging road up Chemainus River to just west of power line, turn right onto power line road and follow north to 1st height of land.

The whole area has a gentle 15-20° slope to south and is covered with a maze of old logging railway roadbeds, salal brush, second growth forest and, in fact is a veritable jungle.

Rock outcrops are less than 1/2 of a percent of area and very hard to find because of hip to shoulder height dense ground cover.

Previous owners must have given up in desperation from west coast jungle like vegetation and absence of rock in place. Apparently no previous work had ever been done on this ground as no records of same exist nor is there any evidence on ground.

Present work has consisted of prospecting; interpretation: searching for minerals, but first we must find the rocks in place that the minerals may be in.

All rocks found on these claims and outside boundaries of these claims consist of conglomerates of the Nanaimo formation.

It has been found that in most areas this formation is a solid mass overlaying other unknown rock types a few small (1 to 3 acre) areas appear to have been internally highly fractured.

These fractured areas are gossaned presumably from some form of iron stain.

Prospecting has been done to try and find weak spots in the conglomerate cap so that physical work and geo chem testing in the future can be applied to areas which will most likely give positive mineralization indications.

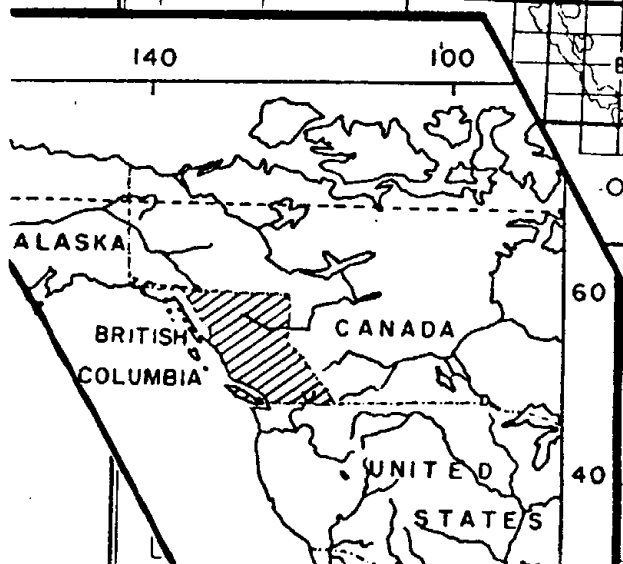
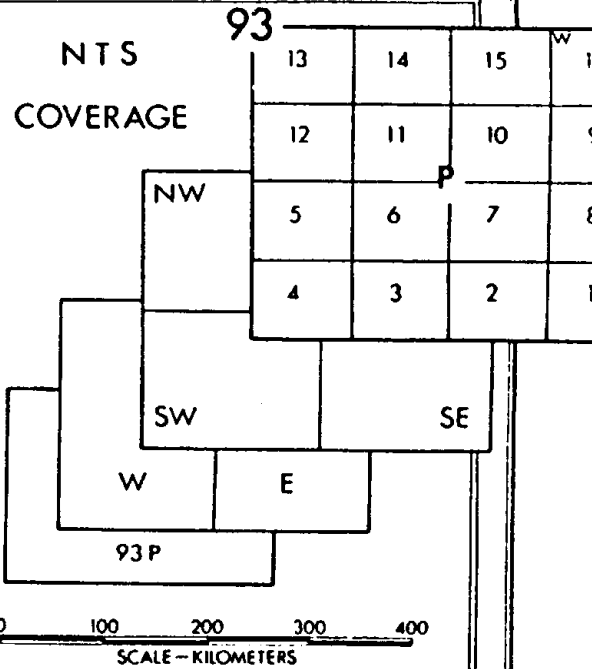
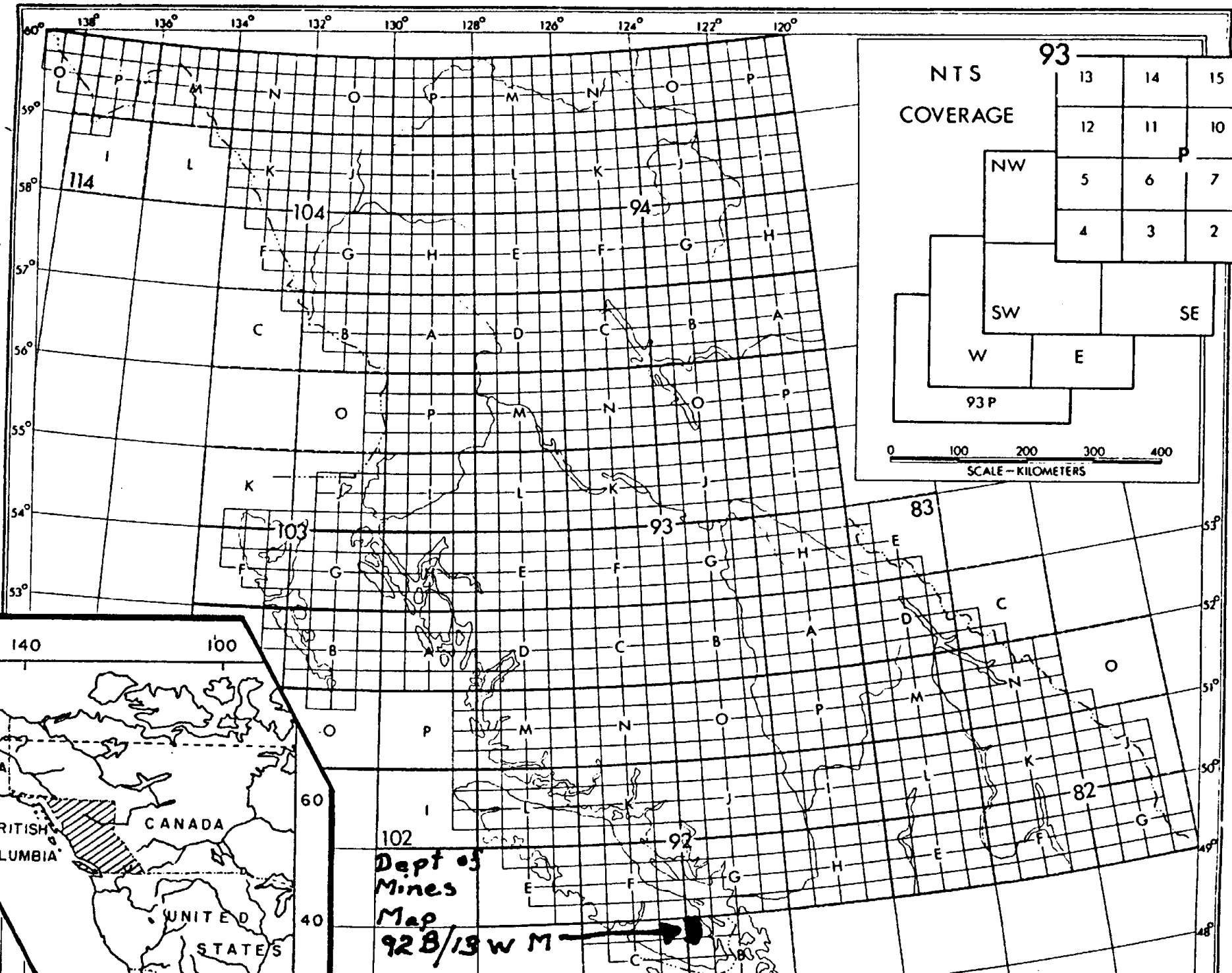
RYAN CLAIMS

Two men with two 4 x 4 vehicles generally working a 10 hour day in the bush and working independently of each other so as to cover more ground.

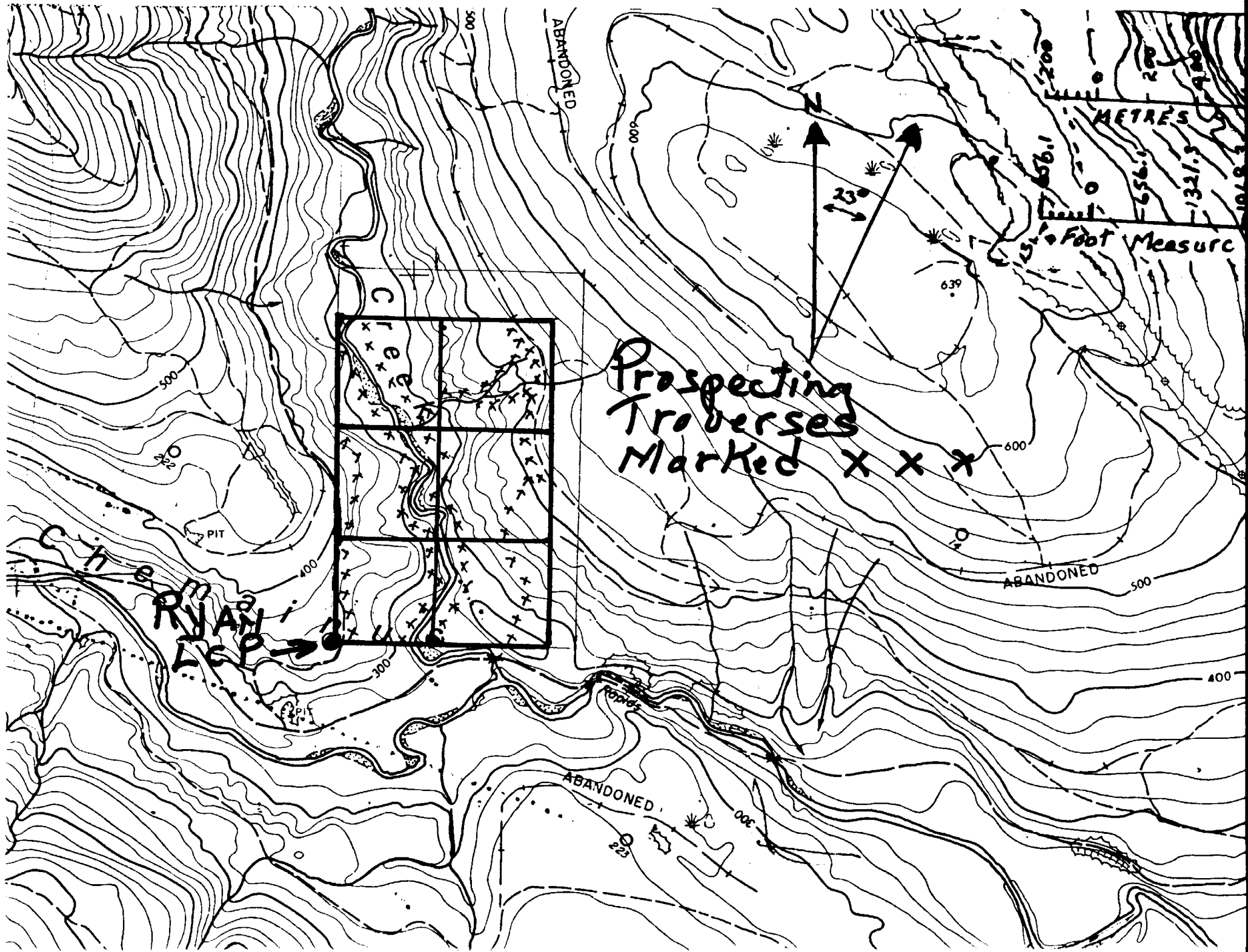
