#### 1.00 <u>Introduction</u>

Mr. L. Stephenson staked the DEK 22 -29 Claims in August of 1997 and under took to evaluate and locate the extension of the Southeast-northwest striking "Jake Showing" located on the adjacent claims. This showing is projected to be on the St. Eugene Mine trend as projected from the Society Girl deposit through the "Pipeline Showing" located 1.5 km to northwest of the property.

A geological prospecting survey was completed to establish the actual position of the early 1990's exploration work. Rock samples were taken that are representative of the Creston Formation and Kitchener Formation rocks which respectively, overlie the Upper Aldridge Formation.

#### 2.00 <u>Location and Access</u>

The DEK 22-29 Claims are located east southeast of the town of Moyie, British Columbia. Access is provided to the claims via the South Main Teepee Creek and the Jake Creek logging roads.

#### 3.00 <u>Geological Prospecting and Mapping</u>

Geological prospecting traverses were conducted across the claims utilizing the logging roads to confirm the geology. The Index map (Map 2) shows the traverses and the Prospecting Traverse Sampling map (Map 3) shows the showings and outcrop areas located to date on the Claims.

Rock types identified as Creston Formation underlay most of the DEK 22 - 29 Claims, but increasing float to sub-outcrop samples of statigraphically higher Kitchener formation to the east suggests that part of the claims are underlain by that formation.

No previous assessment reports have been "published" on these claims. Although float boulders of gabbro were identified in the area no outcrops were encountered in the prospecting traverses. The Creston rocks are mainly argillite-argillaceous quartzites with a few thick quartzite units. Most of the observed outcrops consisted of thin 3 - 5 cm thick beds The units were striking north-south with a gentle easterly dip (15-20 degrees). The best exposures of these rocks were found along the South Main Teepee Creek road, the

No distinct structural features were noted in the prospecting traverses.


#### 4.00 <u>Mineralization</u>


No evidence of mineralization was observed on the DEK 8-12 Claims.

#### 5.00 <u>Conclusions</u>

The DEK 8-12 Claims could have the projected trend associated with the St. Eugene Mine where it cuts the Creston rocks although no distinctive evidence was found. Since the Creston rocks stratigraphically overlay the Aldridge rocks which host the main St. Eugene deposit and the claims lie between the Pipeline Showing to the north and the Jake showing to the south, the structure would be projected through these claims.
